

LTTE calls off ceasefire

Last afternoon the LTTE called off the one week long ceasefire which was expected to expire today, according to reliable reports from the North.

The LTTE high command in its radio broadcasts to cadres in the North-

East ordered to resume military action, was monitored by security sources.
