Leader of the EPDP told the prime minister that the LTTE was not the sole representative of the Tamils and stressed the need for the

LTTE to genuinely enter the democratic path".

Mr. Douglas Devananda told the premier that her government should also be careful in dealing with the LTTE as done earlier as the Tigers may use the period of 'negotiations' to rebuild their military power.

When the prime minister brought up the matter of the state of the emergency and said that she wanted to lift it in areas other than the North East, all Tamil leaders agreed and indicated that they were in favour of the proposal.

The Tamil party lead-

ers thanked the prime minister for partially lifting the embargo to supply essential food items to the people in the Jaffna Peninsula.
